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ABOUT THE REPORT

This document is the 8th rare birds report of the Extremaduran Rarities Committee (CREX), established in 2016 and currently comprised of five members. This report contains a total of 67 records of rare bird species) in the Extremadura region in southwest Spain. 98% of records are from 2024. 86.6% of records received were accepted by the committee.

Highlights in 2024 included the first record of Yellow-billed Egret *Ardea brachyrhyncha* for Spain, and only the fourth for the Western Palearctic, and Extremadura's first Caspian Gull *Larus cachinnans* as well as the region's second records of Blue-winged Teal *Spatula discors*, White-rumped Sandpiper *Calidris fuscicollis*, White-backed Vulture *Gyps africanus* and Rough-legged Buzzard *Buteo lagopus*. Additionally, several species were recorded in the region for the first time in a number of years, for example Common Scoter *Melanitta nigra* (the first record since 2016), Red-necked Phalarope *Phalaropus lobatus* (*ditto*) and Ring-necked Duck *Aythya collaris* (the first record since 2019). 2024 was a noteworthy year for rare waterfowl: a group of six Brent Goose *Branta bernicla*, a Tundra Bean Goose *Anser serrirostris*, two American Green-winged Teal *Anas crecca carolinensis* and two new records of Marbled Duck *Marmaronetta angustirostris*, a species whose presence in the region probably involved individuals from the ongoing reintroduction programme in Andalusia.

INTRODUCTION

This is the eighth rare birds report from the **Extremaduran Rarities Committee (CREX)**. CREX was founded in early 2016 and it oversees the collection and assessment of all records of bird species considered regional rarities in the Extremaduran region. The committee forwards records of national rarities (NR) recorded in the region to the Spanish SEO National Rarities Committee (NC).

REPORT LAYOUT

Nearly all records in this respond correspond to the year 2024, save a single record from December 2023. Species recorded in the report appear in taxonomical order and each observation is broken down into the following order: 1) year; 2) province (in Extremadura, Caceres to the north or Badajoz to the south); 3) number of individuals observed; 4) number of individuals observed; 5) age and sex if known, abbreviated as ad (adult) imm (immature), 1st yr (first year), 2cy (second calendar-year); 5) site (reservoir is abbreviated as 'res.') followed by the municipality; 6) date or period of the record (with months abbreviated to three letters, e.g. Jan, Feb, Mar); 7) name of the observer(s), from forms submitted to the CREX website or from details from other online forums; 8) photo, accredited to the photographer, where an image of the record was submitted as evidence.

How we work

We have attempted to compile as many records of rare birds in the region as possible since our inception in 2016. Both historic and recent records are assessed, although the majority of records refer to 2016 to date. A total of 810 records have been processed so far (January 2025). It should be noted that the records included here only refer to records submitted directly by individual observers from or outwith the region, or to records posted on local online forums like foroavex or RRSS or platforms like eBird and Observado.

In this report a total of 67 records were assessed, 59 (88%) of which referred to local rarities (LR) and 8 (12%) to national rarities (NR). These latter corresponded to eight taxa: *Anser serrirostris*, *Anas crecca carolinensis*, *Anas discors*, *Ardea brachyrhyncha*, *Calidris fuscicollis*, *Gyps africanus*, *Buteo lagopus* and *Falco biarmicus*. These records were forwarded to the Spanish SEO National Rarities Committee (NC-SEO). However CREX have carried out a provisional assessment of records of national rarities pending the National Committee's decisions.

Of the 67 records received, 58 (86.5%) were accepted by the committee, with the rest rejected. As with other regional rarities committees, the committee assesses each record according to all written, recorded or photographic evidence provided by the observer(s), and decides if the record is irrefutable or lacking in information or evidence. Records are divided into four categories:

A) Accepted Records: records of rare wild bird species considered irrefutable according to the information provided.

B) Records attributed to species of uncertain origin.

C) Pending Records: records that lacked sufficient supporting evidence or where expert, diagnostic opinion was sought but not yet received. This category will be held until more evidence is provided.

D) Rejected Records: records whose documentation is lacking, resulting in an ability to clearly determine which species is involved. However, rejected records are reconsidered where new supporting evidence is provided.

By the biological name in italics of each species, a code appears in brackets separated by a slash, (x/x). The first value refers to the number of records of the species in Extremadura thus far processed by CREX and the second refers to the total number of individuals recorded. It should be noted that these figures do not correspond to the real totals for the region, as many historical records have not been assessed by the committee. Criteria for the inclusion of species on the Extremaduran Rarities List are as follows:

- Less than 40 records in the last ten years (average of four annual records).
- Less than three annual records in seven of the last ten years.
- Three or more years with no records in the last ten years.

NORTHERN BALD IBIS

Geronticus eremita (8/13)

- **2024. BADAJOZ.** 1 ad Cabeza del Buey from 18th Jan (Eva Drukker *et al.*) to 9th Dec. Presumably the same individual present at the site since 2022, with a series of observations there since then. This is a male born in 2020 at Basilea Zoo and released at Barbate (Cádiz province, Andalusia) in Feb 2021 as part of the reintroduction programme there.

- **2024. BADAJOZ.** 1 Fregenal de la Sierra from 27th Oct (Birdtrack App GPS) to 5th Nov. Found dead on 5th Nov by agents from the Department of the Environment, autopsy results pending.



BEARDED VULTURE

Gypaetus barbatus (12/12)

- **2024. CÁCERES.** A 2cy individual at Garganta de Los Infiernos, Jerte 16th Mar (Ángel Vicente Simón *et al.*). was Zapardiel, a male released in the Gredos range in 2023, fitted with green wing tags with the code 5U in white. The same individual was seen again at Collado Cardiel, Tornavacas on 17th Jul (Raquel Lozano and Hugo Sánchez).
- **2024. CÁCERES.** A 2cy individual at Cogotón de Tornavacas (between Jerte and Tornavacas) on 1st May (Juan Antonio Torres). Presumably a different individual. Thought to have come from Cazorla due to tail discolouration.

WHITE-BACKED VULTURE (NR)

A GPS-fitted individual that entered Spain from the south on 16th Jun and arrived in Extremadura the next day, circling Badajoz province between Malcycinado, Berlanga, Maguilla, Capillo de Llerena, Hornachos, Guareña, La Coronada and Puerto Mejoral. A signal continued being received in the area to 3rd Jul and then again on 13th Jul (Zbigniew Kajzer and Michal Skapski). Accepted by NC-SEO (see Pardo de Santayana *et al.* 2024b).
